THE PROBLEM

There is a major gap between the need for life-saving technologies, such as medications for HIV/AIDS, and their actual availability in the developing world where their need is the greatest. This gap means that lives are being lost – not because we do not have the health innovations to save them, but because we have not made those innovations available.

- Adopt a policy that reflects global access principles
- Apply these principles by including equitable licensing provisions in negotiations for licensing agreements
- Ensure transparency in the application of equitable licensing provisions
